GUIDE FOR PRISONERS, EX-PRISONERS AND PROBATIONERS ON THEIR LEGAL, SOCIAL AND MEDICAL SERVICES IN 2020



2020

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- The aim of the guide is to provide information for prisoners, ex-prisoners and probationers about their legal, social and medical services in order to promote crime prevention and rehabilitation and resocialization of persons in conflict with the law.
- The guide provides information on the planned services for 2020 in the following cities of Georgia: Batumi, Zugdidi, Tbilisi, Telavi, Rustavi, Kutaisi.
- **The guide includes the services in the following areas:**

SOCIAL SERVICES

- Providing housing / shelter;
- State health insurance program;
- Protection of women / children victims of domestic violence;
- Providing free food;
- One-time cash or non-cash allowances;
- Providing transportation costs;
- Granting special status (persons with disabilities, victims of violence, IDPs, socially vulnerable, refugees, etc.).
- Other state social services.

EDUCATIONAL AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

- Professional education;
- Training courses (language, computer skills, lifelong learning support activities);
- Other training and preparation courses;
- School preparation courses for students and entrants;
- Develop skills needed for employment;
- Employment promotion trainings;
- Government programs for vulnerable groups (funding, grants, employment);
- Internship programs.

MEDICAL SERVICES

- State-funded treatment programs;
- Reproductive health programs;
- Healthy lifestyle support programs;
- Programs for overcoming drug addiction;
- Alcohol dependency reduction programs;
- Replacement therapy programs;
- State and private psychiatric services;
- Diagnosis of infectious and communicable diseases;
- Financing of medicines;
- Funding or co-financing of required research.

LEGAL SERVICES

- Legal services;
- Measures to promote civic education;
- Working with documents - consulting services.

PSYCOSOCIAL SERVICES

- Social skills development programs;
- Psychologist services;
- Various community services;
- Volunteer activities;
- Civic awareness raising programs.

OTHER SERVICES

- Sports events;
- Cultural events;
- Art or thematic clubs;
- Libraries;
- Community centers;
- Religious organizations.

- The Guide provides information on services in the following format:
- The guide consists of seven chapters: The first chapter contains information on services available in all six cities. The following chapters provide information on services available in each city.
- Each chapter is divided into two sections, services offered by governmental and non-governmental sectors, which are structured in the areas outlined in the Chart.
- Information about services is represented by the following way:
- **Organization** - the name of the service provider organization;
- **Services** - Name of Service / Program / Project;
- **Service description** - purpose of the service, specific activities, duration (when the service name fully reflects the content of the service, this data is not given);
- **Target group** - who can be the recipient of the service;
- **Financing** - How many benefits does the organization provide to each citizen or
- **Service Fee** - Service Fee if applicable;
- **Places** - Number of available services for the target group, when a specified number exists;
- Procedures for inclusion - how to get services;
- **Excluding Criteria** - a condition that prevents the target group from engaging in the service, if any;
- **Term** - length of service.

Contact information – telephone number, e-mail, web-page, social media contact info;

- Services aimed at or involving minors are marked with a mark *.
