



## SAFEGUARD CHILDREN IN DETENTION FROM VIOLENCE: WHAT DO WE STILL NEED?

## Children in detention are, first and foremost, children.

Even in detention, states must protect them.

### **INTERNATIONAL LEVEL**

- Development of specific indicators and strategies that define and target VAC in detention
- Visibility of the issue in political contexts

### **EU LEVEL**

- Harmonised EU definition on VAC in detention and its forms
- Harmonised and robust data collection tools and methods
- Efficient sharing of information, best practices and policies

### NATIONAL LEVEL

- Child protection policies and strategies that explicitly include the protection from violence of children in detention
- Solid cooperation mechanisms to ensure accountability and policy changes



### DATA COLLECTION AND INTERNAL MONITORING

- Dedicated standard operating procedures for monitoring and responding to VAC
- Robust and consistent data collection methods
- Specialised trainings for professionals.
- Broader scope to report ALL VAC episodes, not just criminally relevant cases. Clear definitions and procedures for disciplinary sanctions and restrictive measures
- Comprehensive disaggregation and meaningful data analysis, while ensuring data protection and privacy
- Detailed data breakdown and analysis for vulnerable groups, to understand intersectionality of vulnerabilities
- Targeted protection strategies for LGBTI+ children and other minorities
